

Your On-Track Guide to the *MassTransfer Program*

If you have submitted an official transcript from a public Massachusetts Community College, you might be eligible for MassTransfer benefits such as the MassTransfer Block or the MassTransfer Tuition Credit. The [MassTransfer Block](#) relates to your general education requirements. The [MassTransfer Tuition Credit](#) applies to students who enroll at UMass Boston within one year of the completion of an associate's degree with a 3.0 or higher GPA.

Requirements that the MassTransfer Block will complete:

- Verbal Reasoning & Expression: English 101 & 102
- Arts/ Humanities Distribution areas
- Social Behavioral Sciences Distribution areas
- Natural Science/ Mathematics Distribution areas

MassTransfer Block Notes:

- Also referred to as: GenEd Block, General Education Foundation, STEM Block
- Does not complete the World Language / World Cultures Distribution areas
- Where it can be found in WISER system:
 - [Degree Audit](#): In "TRANSFERCOURSES" Section
 - Transfer Evaluations: Course: MTRAN COMP and Title: MASSTRANSFER BLOCK COMP

*If the MassTransfer Block is not listed in WISER and the student has completed it, please contact the Undergraduate Admissions Office. Undergraduate Admissions will check the student's most recent official transcript to see if the MassTransfer block is listed as completed on the transcript.

MassTransfer Tuition Credit:

Students are eligible for the MassTransfer Tuition Credit if they have completed an associate's degree at a Massachusetts Community College (except Quincy College). Earn a cumulative GPA of 3.0. Enroll at UMass Boston within one year of completion of associate's degree.

Advising Notes:

- **Linked Program:** If a student completes a Linked Program and is receiving under 60 transfer credits, please contact the Undergraduate Admissions Office. To verify a linked program, please visit the [MassTransfer](#) website.
- **Reverse Transfer:** Students who complete 30 credits at a Massachusetts community college and transfer without earning an associate's are eligible to apply UMass Boston credits toward their community college degree. Reverse Transfer allows students to earn their associate degree while also earning a bachelor's degree at UMass Boston at no additional cost.
