General Transfer Credit Policies

- Courses must be a C- or higher and be considered college-level.
- A maximum of 90 credits can be transferred from a four-year school and 70 credits from a community college.
- Course content is comparable in scope to coursework offered at UMass Boston.
- Courses taken Pass/Fail are only eligible to transfer if the transcript key equates these courses to a C- (due to COVID-19, all P grades from Spring and Fall 2020 are eligible to transfer).
- **Courses must be a minimum of 3 semester credit hours to fulfill a program requirement.**

How to Use this Sheet

- This sheet includes the general requirements for the College of Management.
- For set course requirements (i.e. English 101), the Bunker Hill Course requirement is listed on the sheet. For distribution requirements, students can select from a list of available courses. Simply select “Arts” on the planning sheet and you will be brought to a section with all the available art courses.
- Students are also encouraged to use our Transfer Course Database, **Transferology**, to match UMass Boston courses with your current institution. Fill out the “Bunker Hill Course Code” section with courses you have already taken or plan to take before enrolling at UMass Boston.
