Active Threats (Hostile Person with a Weapon)

If there is an active threat in your area, determine the best course of action based on your location relative to the threat. There are three options: Run: Evacuate the area if it is possible to do so safely.

Hide: If you can't evacuate safely, hide and silence all cell phones and computers. Fight: Fighting is a last resort. Be sure to commit to this action only if necessary.

Earthquakes

Although earthquakes are rare in the Northeast, they can occur. Here's what to do: Drop: Get on the ground. If unable to get on the ground, get as low as possible. Cover: Take cover under sturdy furniture. At minimum, cover your head. Hold on: Stay put until the shaking stops. Follow the directions of first responders.

Storms and Emergency Campus Closures

In the unlikely event of a tornado warning, take shelter immediately. For hurricanes, nor'easters, and blizzards, stock up on food, water, medications, and other necessities. Be ready to shelter in place.

Personal Emergencies (Emotional Distress)

UMass Boston provides help to members of our campus community who are in emotional distress. Life-threatening emergency

- Stay out of construction sites. Do not jump fences or attempt to cut through prohibited areas of campus.

1. Before the emergency, PLAN.

Make sure your cell phone number is correct in the UMass Boston Alert System (getrave.com/login/umb). Ensure that government-issued alerts are also enabled on your cell phone.

Familiarize yourself with resources at umb.edu/preparedness:

- Personal emergency plan
- What to do in an emergency
- Building-specific and campus-wide evacuation plans
- University policies relating to preparedness and response
- Training opportunities
- Links to other resources

Note exits and maintain situational awareness.

Know what to do in specific emergencies. Attend safety and preparedness trainings.

2. If an emergency occurs, EVALUATE the situation and assess your options.

Remain calm. Follow the directions of first responders. If alone, rely on your knowledge of emergency protocols. To report an emergency, call 911 when safe to do so. To reach UMB Police & Public Safety directly, call 617.287.7777.

Confirmed information and recommended protective actions will be conveyed via the UMass Boston Alert System.

Some initial reports on social media during emergencies may be inaccurate. Look for authoritative sources of information such as UMass Boston accounts and those of the Boston Police, Massachusetts State Police, the National Weather Service, and the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency.

3. Then, RESPOND.

Different emergencies require different responses. For example, first responders or alerts may direct you to avoid an area, evacuate, or shelter in place. **Avoid the area:** Stay clear of the specified area. **Evacuate:**

Remain calm and proceed to the exit. Follow posted evacuation plans and the directions of first responders. Do not use elevators.

- Never ignore a fire alarm.
- A campus-wide evacuation may require a non-vehicular (walking) exit from campus.
 UMB PD will address access and functional needs if a non-vehicular evacuation is required.

Shelter in place:

- Move to an interior space, away from windows.
- For severe weather, move to the lowest floor possible.
- Remain sheltered until authorities advise that it is safe to leave.
